

State-wise Quarantine Guidelines

Bihar



Domestic

Institutional quarantine

Patna: No institutional quarantine.

Darbhanga: Passengers undergoing Rapid Antigen Test upon arrival, If found Positive for Covid-19 they will be sent to Institutional quarantine where they will be tested again through RT-PCR mode where the final decision for Institutional/Home quarantine will be taken by State Health Authorities depending on the result of the test.

Gaya: No quarantine.

Home quarantine

Patna: No home quarantine.

Darbhanga: Depending upon the result of the test, State Health Authorities will determine the Home quarantine

Gaya: 10 days home quarantine.

Health screening

Patna/ Darbhanga: Thermal Screening mandatory for all Incoming/Outgoing passengers.

Gaya: Thermal screening shall be done upon arrival.

Covid test

Patna: No RTPCR/RAT test for covid-19 required.

Darbhanga: Passengers coming specifically from Maharashtra, Kerala, and Punjab have to produce a Negative Covid-19 RT-PCR report within 72 Hours. In case of lacking the Negative Covid-19 report, they have to undergo Rapid Antigen Test for the same for which the medical team of the health department has been deputed to the airport by Bihar government.

Gaya:

- Passengers coming from Maharashtra, Kerala, Punjab, and Delhi, will have to produce a negative RT-PCR test report without fail where the RT-PCR test should have been done within 72 hrs before the commencement of the journey.
- Passengers arriving from states other than mentioned above will undergo Rapid Antigen Test on a random basis at Airport and will be allowed to leave the airport as per their Test result (Bihar Govt. order dated 15.03.2021)
- Random tests for Passengers coming from other states shall be taken.
- In case of non-availability of above documents passengers coming from above states have to undergo a Rapid Antigen Test test available at Airport.

Passenger obligation

Patna/Darbhanga:

- All passengers must download the Aarogya Setu App.
- Wearing of Masks is made compulsory for entry into Terminal Building.

Gaya: Passengers shall have to wear a mask properly, maintain social distancing upon arrival and follow medical team instructions.

Airline obligation

Patna: All Airlines Shall make an onboard announcement for proper disposal of PPEs in biohazard bins.

Darbhanga: Shall make an on-board announcement for proper disposal of PPEs in biohazard bins.

Gaya

- The Airlines should make time-to-time announcements through the PA system for maintaining social distancing and wearing masks properly.
- They shall also keep passengers updated regarding changing COVID-19 guidelines from time to time.
- Airlines should ensure that Pax coming from Maharashtra, Kerala, Punjab, and Delhi should be allowed to board only if they are having a negative RT-PCR test report where RT-PCR test should have been done within 72 hrs before the commencement of journey.

Airport or State obligation

Patna

- Thermal Screening is being carried out for every arriving passenger at the airport.
- No RT-PCR/Rapid Antigen Test for Covid-19 required

Darbhanga

- Thermal Screening is being carried out for every arriving passenger at the airport.
- Passengers coming specifically from Maharashtra, Kerala, and Punjab have to produce a Negative Covid-19 report of not older than 72 Hours. In case of absence of the Negative Covid-19 report, they have to undergo Rapid Antigen Test for the same for which the medical team of the health department has been deputed to the airport by Bihar government.

Gaya: Coordinate with the medical team for COVID-19 test of incoming passengers
